REBECCA'S WILD FARM

When wildlife filmmaker Rebecca's father is close to retirement she returns to the family's wildlife-friendly farm in Devon to become the next generation to farm the land. Realising that all food production in the UK is completely dependent on abundant cheap fossil fuel, particularly oil, she sets out to discover just how secure this oil supply is.

Alarmed by the answers, she explores ways of farming without using fossil fuel. With the help of pioneering farmers and growers, Rebecca learns that it is actually Nature that holds the key to farming in a low-energy future.

Rebecca's Wild Farm was made by BBC Natural World and looks at how traditional and ecological farming methods can compete in the 20th century and how they will be essential as we enter a period of reducing availability of oil.

Transition Haslemere is showing Rebecca's Wild Farm at the Haslemere Museum on Wednesday 25 August at 7.30 pm .
